

BUSH TUCKER GARDEN PROJECT

The development of a new bush tucker garden space at Mallee District Aboriginal Services, Kerang is continuing with the support of Northern District Community Health and Gannawarra Shire Council. The garden is being funded by Emergency Recovery Victoria through the Gannawarra Flood Recovery Program.

The garden has been named "Tyapa Kurra Kahl" meaning "*To plant on Country*" in Barapa Wamba language. It will be a space for the local Aboriginal community to connect to Country and Culture.

The construction of five new raised Redgum timber garden beds have been completed during the weekly working bees. Thanks to Justin from Triple A Trees for donating his time and machinery to fill the beds with soil during a very hot working bee. The beds have been planted out with a range of bush tucker plants. The Midyam Berry plants have already provided ripe fruit ready for tasting. Other plants in this section of garden included Warrigal greens, Native Thyme, Sea Parsley, Muntries Berries and Native Oregano.

The next steps include planting native lawn, two mural paintings, ground-level garden plantings around the yarning circle area of the garden.

Working bees are continuing each Wednesday with the official opening planned during NAIDOC Week.

FLOOD RECOVERY FUNDED EVENTS

A range of community-led events and activities have occurred recently thanks to funding support from Emergency Recovery Victoria as part of the Gannawarra Flood Recovery Program. While bringing much needed joy to our residents and supporting social connections and mental health and wellbeing, these events also stimulate local business and tourism sector.

Quambatook Silo Cinema: The screening on the Quambatook silos of the iconic Australian movie, The Dish, was held on 22 February 2025. The movie is based on true events of the 1969 Moon landing and the involvement of the Parkes radio telescope. Hosted by the Quambatook Silo Cinema Committee the event was attended by several hundred community members.





Kerang Lunar Festival: After nine months of planning, cultural diversity was embraced and celebrated as hundreds of community members attended the inaugural Lunar Festival on Saturday 8 March. The event, delivered by the Kerang Progress Association, featured Vietnamese lion dancers, traditional music, Indian dancers and interactive workshops, and Asian music and dance. Local primary school students also performed.

Lake Meran Festival: An evening of musical entertainment on the picturesque shore of Lake Meran was enjoyed by hundreds of locals on Sunday 23 February. Delivered by the Lake Meran Foreshore Committee, the event featured live music, local beverages and food trucks and



children's activities. A large turtle sculpture "Grumpy" was also unveiled as part of the festivities.



Kerryn Finch Art Workshop: Kerang Progress Association hosted an art workshop with local artist, Kerryn Finch. Kerryn shared her expertise on capturing native flora with a variety of painting techniques. The workshop was at capacity with participants producing some beautiful artwork.

International Women's Day: A

breakfast to celebrate International Women's Day was held 7 March in Cohuna. The event celebrated the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women, while also highlighting a call to action for a gender equal future. Over 60 community members heard inspiring stories from Koondrook singer/songwriter Elise Drake and Cohuna District Hospital's Director of Clinical Services, Wendy Lunghusen.



Indigenous Outreach Project (IOP) – Dance Program:



More than 1,200 students from all schools across the Gannawarra Shire participated in an indigenous dance troop and cultural activity program held between 3-6 March. IOP successfully uses dance and music to foster change and deliver healthy and positive messages around the theme 'Be Proud, No Shame,

Respect'. It was great to see all school students connecting together and participating enthusiastically in this culture experience. Funding was also received from the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) to support this shire-wide program.

Gannawarra Sporting Club Dinner: A Sporting Club Dinner was held at the Koondrook Recreation Reserve on 25 March. The event was attended by 60 community members and included the official launch of the Gannawarra Fair Access Policy and keynote speakers The Grants Guy, Keith Whelan, and Laura Bradley from Sports Focus. MC for the evening was Brihony Dawson and catering by the Long Paddock Food Store, Koondrook.
