2025-2029 GANNAWARRA SHIRE COUNCIL PLAN

Council has spent the past two months working with residents to develop what will become the 2025-2029 Gannawarra Shire Council Plan.

Developed every four years, the latest edition of the Council Plan will reflect what communities across the Gannawarra want Council to achieve between July 2025 and June 2029.

The document will also include the latest version of Council's Municipal Health and Wellbeing Plan and the municipality's Community Vision for the next 10 years.

As part of the engagement process, residents are able to complete a five-question survey regarding what people like most about where they live, their community's current challenges, what Council can do create healthier and safer communities, what priorities Council should achieve during the next 10 years, and whether the current Community Vision and goals still represent their community's aspirations.

Various community pop-up sessions have also occurred, enabling Councillors and staff to discuss local matters with residents.

Feedback received during the secondary engagement period will assist with the development of the final version of the *2025-2029 Gannawarra Shire Council Plan,* which must be adopted by Council by 31 October 2025.

COHUNA, KERANG COMMUNITY PLANS BEING DEVELOPED

Council is currently working with Cohuna and Kerang residents to develop community plans that reflect each town's uniqueness and priorities.

Following on from the success of the Connecting Gannawarra program that led to the creation of community plans for six of the Gannawarra's smaller communities, a similar process will be used to build on community planning work undertaken since 2008 to develop community plans for the municipality's two largest towns.



As part of the first stage of developing the two community plans, residents who have called into *Gannawarra Shire Council 2025-2029 Council Plan* pop-up sessions have been able to complete a survey outlining their views of their home town. All responses received will assist with developing priorities for each community. Meetings will be held at Cohuna and Kerang in mid-2025 to determine if these priorities are accurate.



KEEP RECYCLING YOUR GLASS BOTTLES

Residents are encouraged to continue taking their household glass bottles to any of Council's transfer stations at Cohuna, Kerang, Lalbert and Quambatook, or the Koondrook depot, for recycling.



Not only are all bottles and jars handed in for recycling turned into new products such as roads and construction material, this process reduces instances where contents from yellow household recycling bins are redirected to landfill due to broken glass materials.

HELP SHAPE COUNCIL'S SOCIAL INCLUSION STRATEGY

Residents are encouraged to help Council update its Social Inclusion Strategy - a document that helps Council work with the community to ensure all residents feel valued, accepted and included.

Work is currently occurring to develop what will become Council's 2025-2029 Social Inclusion Strategy, which is Council's commitment to reducing barriers for groups most at risk of being excluded from our community. These people include those with disability, who are culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD), who are Indigenous, who identify as LGBTQIA+, young people, older people and community members facing socioeconomic disadvantage.

FIVE WEEKS LEFT TO ENJOY THE OUTDOOR SWIMMING POOL SEASON

Residents have less than five weeks to experience the Cohuna and Kerang swimming pools before both facilities close for the autumn/winter break.

Both outdoor pools are open 10am-8pm weekends and 3pm-8pm weekdays during February.

Opening hours will be reduced to 3pm-7pm daily from 1-9



March, with both sites open 12 noon-7pm on the Labour Day public holiday (10 March), which marks the final day of the season.

People looking to keep active once the outdoor swimming pool season is over will be able to do so at the Kerang Exercise Pool. Located in Kerang's Patchell Plaza, the pool is open 7am-2pm Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and 11am-2pm Tuesdays and Thursdays.

REPAIRS TO FLOOD-DAMAGED ROADS CONTINUE

Work continues to repair Councilmanaged roads damaged by the 2022 floods.

As of mid-January, repairs were occurring on Council-managed sealed roads, as well as on various roads damaged by flooding of the Avoca River, Loddon River and Pyramid Creek.

Council is working with contractors to ensure these works, which have received State Government approval to proceed, are completed in a timely manner.

The repair to Council-managed roads damaged by the 2022 floods is made possible thanks to joint Commonwealth and State Government-funded Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

PROJECTS UPDATE



BRIDGE REPLACEMENT WORKS CONTINUE

Visitor to Apex Park, Reedy Lake are benefiting from the replacement of the Apex Park Road bridge (above).

Work occurred throughout late 2024 to install a new concrete bridge spanning Washpen Creek after the original structure collapsed in mid-2023, limiting access to the popular Apex Park facilities and campsite.

Meanwhile, work will soon begin to replace the Kervins Road bridge, located east of Cohuna, with a new concrete structure after inspections found the current structure was suffering from defects.

Changes to road access whilst these works are occurring will be promoted via Council's website, Gannawarra News and Council's Facebook page.

Both projects, which form part of Council's 2024/25 capital works program are supported by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

GLASSHOUSE @ THE GANNAWARRA TAKING SHAPE

The Glasshouse @ The Gannawarra - the municipality's newest community meeting and Gannawarra Library Service activity space - is taking shape.



Work occurred throughout January to pour the building's slab, with the installation of steelwork and roofing to occur throughout February. This work will also connect the building to the adjoining Sir John Gorton Library.

Once completed, the site will allow the Gannawarra Library Service to plan and deliver youth programs including movie making, sound and music recording, whilst the flexible and scalable meeting space will have the technology necessary for modern meetings, conferences and training sessions.

The \$3.07 million *Glasshouse @ The Gannawarra* project is supported by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, the State Government's Living Libraries Infrastructure Program and Council's 2024/25 capital works program.

MURRAY PARADE, KOONDROOK UPGRADE

Efforts are currently occurring to upgrade Murray Parade, Koondrook between Forest Street and Grigg Road.

Occurring as part of Council's 2024/25 capital works program, the project involves realigning Murray Parade to ensure the road is located within the road reserve, ensuring it complies with infrastructure standards.

The project also includes sealing the road surface and installing new stormwater drainage systems. If necessary, existing powerlines may need to be realigned to accommodate the new road layout to ensure all infrastructure meets safety standards.

The improvements will enable all-weather access to this section of the town, which will benefit current and future residents, as well as visitors to the area.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

FREE RANGE POULTRY PROJECT NEARING COMPLETION

Kinross Farms' largescale free-range egg project at Kerang East is on track to be operational by June.

The site will create 25 jobs, with the team to oversee the housing of 400,000 birds across the site's four laying barns.

During late 2024, work occurred to construct the four 300-metre long sheds that will house the birds, with the site critical in maintaining egg production in Victoria in light of the bird flu outbreaks that have impacted major supply chains.

Kinross Farm is committed to long term, sustainable growth in regional Victoria, and will continue to invest and fulfill the highest standard of welfare and husbandry.

GANNAWARRA-PRODUCED EGGS TO YOUR PLATE

Residents will be able to buy locally-produced Kinross Farms eggs under the Sunny Queen Farms brand, which is stocked in local supermarkets right across Australia.

Like many major egg producers, Kinross Farms utilises all of the eggs produced and supplies a range of high quality liquid egg products to the food service and manufacturing industry.

Kinross Farms uses a high-tech, triple-tube pasteurising and homogenising technique to deliver a range of convenient and specialised liquid egg products that are used for cakes, pasta, ice-cream and mayonnaise.

The range of liquid eggs are available chilled or frozen and can accommodate large and small manufacturers. Most of the large hotel chains use liquid eggs in their menus, whilst scrambled egg mixes are used extensively in large and small enterprises.

WHO ARE KINROSS FARMS?

One of Victoria's largest egg producers, Kinross Farms started as a family business in the mid-1960s when post-World War Two migrants, Mike and Kathleen Szepe, and Judy Fadgyjas set up a farm with a small flock of 2,500 hens in Kinglake West.

Now owned and operated by Judy Fadgyjas' grandson, Philip Szepe and his wife, Jane, Kinross' main operations are located in the foothills of Victoria's Great Dividing Range.

Philip and Jane's sons are also involved in the business, which employs more than 200 staff in a variety of farming roles and support functions.

DIVERSIFYING OUR LOCAL AGRICULTURAL SECTOR

Kinross Farms' Kerang East project is another example of investment in the Gannawarra that is diversifying our local agricultural sector.

With the reduction in the amount of water available for traditional agricultural practices, such as irrigation, due to changing weather patterns and the Murray-Darling Basin Plan, Council has advocated for private investment in diverse agricultural practices.

This work has resulted in various agricultural projects currently operating or proposed for the municipality, including medicinal cannabis, dairy feed barns, beef feed lotting, organic egg production, intensive irrigated cropping, dairy feed lotting, mining and renewable energy.
