Voting for who will represent you for the next four years on Council will occur this month.



The 2024 elections will be the first time that Gannawarra Shire will be operating under an unsubdivided structure, meaning that eligible enrolled voters will be voting for elected representatives from across the municipality.

The Victorian Electoral Commission will send ballot packs to all enrolled voters from Monday, 7 October, with completed ballots needing to be returned by post or to the election office, located at 36 Victoria Street, Kerang before 6pm Friday, 25 October.

THE GLASSHOUSE @ THE GANNAWARRA CONSTRUCTION BEGINS THIS MONTH

Visitors to Kerang's Sir John Gorton Library and motorists travelling along Wellington Street will soon notice work occurring at *The Glasshouse @ The Gannawarra* site, with construction work to begin this month.

The \$3.07 million project, supported by funding from the State Government's Living Libraries Infrastructure Program and the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, will involve construction of a public meeting space for groups and event organisers seeking space larger than current local senior citizens



centres and community hall supper rooms, but smaller than the Cohuna and Kerang memorial halls. This space will also incorporate technology required for modern meetings, conferences and training sessions.

The Glasshouse @ The Gannawarra will also support the Gannawarra Library Service to plan and deliver youth programs including movie making, sound and music recording.

LET'S TALK ABOUT THE WEATHER PROGRAM

Residents are able to join a conversation about the impacts of extreme weather during two special events occurring during November.



Council is working with Make a Change Australia and various local partner organisations to coordinate the *Let's Talk About the Weather* program, which aims to facilitate a community-wide discussion about the impact of extreme weather events on residents and communities and prompt new ideas, solutions and approaches for the future.

APEX PARK ROAD, KERVINS ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT WORKS TO BEGIN

Work to replace two of Council's timber bridges will begin in November.

As part of Council's 2024/25 capital works program, Murray Constructions will replace the Apex Park Road bridge with a new concrete structure that will span Washpen Creek near Reedy Lake. This new structure will enable people to access the popular Apex Park facilities and campsite, which have not been accessible after the original bridge collapsed in July 2023 (right).



Work will also occur later this year to replace the Kervins Road bridge, located east of Cohuna, with a new concrete structure after inspections found the current structure was suffering from defects.

A 30-tonne load limit is currently in place until a new structure is constructed, with motorists whose loads are larger than 30 tonnes requested to use Cohuna-McMillans Road, Western Road and Murray Valley Highway to access either side of Kervins Road.

Changes to road access whilst these works are occurring will be promoted via Council's website, *Gannawarra News* and Council's Facebook page.

Both projects are supported by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

ACT NOW TO REDUCE YOUR PROPERTY'S FIRE RISK

Residents are encouraged to act now to reduce fire risks on their properties.

With the weather to warm up during the next 2-3 months, the next few weeks is the ideal time to reduce fine fuels on your property, including bark, leaves, twigs and long grass.




Council will soon begin its fire hazard inspection program, which will identify properties which need to be cleared of fire risks.

Properties deemed to be a high fire risk (e.g. long uncut grass) will be issued with a Fire Prevention Notice instructing the landholder to carry out works to reduce the risk.



KEEPING ACTIVE WITH YOUR PETS

With the weather warming up, residents are encouraged to adhere to rules in place when walking their dogs.

It is the animal owner's responsibility to ensure dogs are on a leash and are controlled at all times.

Dogs must be kept on a leash at all recreation reserves when a sporting fixture is taking place, at playgrounds and parks where children's play equipment is installed, and at the following parks:



- Apex Park, Garden Park and Gilrule Park at Cohuna.
- Atkinson Park at Kerang.
- Gorton Point at Kangaroo Lake.

Dogs can be walked off leash on private property, at recreation reserves when a sporting fixture is not taking place and parks not listed in Council *Policy 68 - Dogs and Cats.*

Dogs off leash in approved areas must be under effective voice control, meaning you must be able to control your dog by the second call.

REPAIRS TO FLOOD-DAMAGED ROADS CONTINUE

Work continues to repair Council-managed roads damaged by the 2022 floods.

As of mid-September, repairs to roads within the Murrabit West and Capels Crossings areas have been completed, and have commenced throughout the north of Kerang before turning to the Tragowel area.

Council is working with contractors to ensure these works are completed in a timely manner, which have received State Government approval to proceed.

The repair to Council-managed roads damaged by the 2022 floods is made possible thanks to joint Commonwealth and State Government-funded Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



FREE RANGE POULTRY PROJECT PROGRESSING

Construction of Kinross Farms' Kerang East large-scale free-range egg project at Kerang East has commenced.

Work has occurred during the past 1-2 months to develop the pads that will form the 160-metre long and 19-metre wide rearing sheds, as well as the 288-metre long and 23-metre wide main sheds.

Once operational, the egg project will employ 25 staff and provide more diversity into the local agricultural sector.

Kinross Farms is one of Victoria's largest egg producers, with the Euroabased company renowned for managing every step of its egg production, from brooding day-old chicks to feed milling, grading and value adding.

PROMOTING THE GANNAWARRA TO THE REGION

If you watched WIN TV during September, you may have seen the updated Gannawarra advertising campaign. Featuring local residents, these advertisements aim to



appeal to visitors and people looking for a lifestyle change.

Council will also re-run its Gannawarra relocation advertising campaign, which will promote local employment, housing and population growth, to maintain the messaging around jobs, housing and population growth. Gannawarra Shire is one of very few rural councils to be recording population growth, and with around 2,300 construction jobs looming, this growth will help bring benefits to the local business sectors, as well as schools and community groups.

HOUSING UPDATE

In preparation for increased job opportunities, Council staff have undertaken the following tasks to develop further local housing and workforce accommodation options:

- Advocating to the Minister for Housing to accelerate housing projects, especially rezoning of land for residential accommodation.
- Working with local accommodation businesses to provide greater capacity for workforce accommodation options.
- Connecting local landowners to housing developers and workforce accommodation providers.
- Advertising to entice more developers into the rental market.
- Assisting businesses with funding applications for electricity, water and sewerage improvements.

MAJOR PROJECT UPDATES

- Transmission Company Victoria staff have been meeting local landowners and conducting property inspections along the proposed VNI West corridor, with the 100-metre easement for the multi-state electricity transmission line to be confirmed soon.
- A Victorian Ministerial decision regarding VHM's Goschen Mineral Sands Project is nearing. Mineral sands are used extensively in a range of modern products.
- Work has started to convert Kerang's former ten-pin bowling alley into The Reject Shop.
